The decline in numbers of permanent, full time residents is generally considered to be a problem in many coastal communities in Cornwall, including Polperro, as houses are seemingly more and more commonly bought for use as second homes or as holiday lets. The perceived danger is that falling numbers of year-round residents will lead to a loss of services and of a sense of community.

Measuring the extent of the problem is complicated by inconsistencies in some basic

records such as the electoral roll and taxation categories: it is not uncommon for second home owners to register to vote locally even though they may visit infrequently; and holiday lets are not always registered for business rate taxes as they should be. Census information records which dwellings were empty on the night of the count, in late March, but the resulting figures are summarised by local administrative area, in this case Lansallos Parish, and it is not possible to identify particular communities such as the centre of Polperro where the problem is likely to be more serious.


Therefore as part of the NDP preparation dwellings have been classified one-by-one based on local knowledge. The table provides a summary for a total of 391 dwellings for which reliable information was available, in the parts of the village shown below.

In summary, 60 percent of dwellings in the centre of the village are occupied by full-time residents, including 46 percent that are owner-occupied and 14 percent rented. The remaining 40 percent include 10 percent which are second homes and 30 percent which are holiday lets. The table below shows a breakdown by street.

Dwellings further from the centre of Polperro are almost all lived in throughout the year, mainly owner occupied in Carey Park, Killigarth and Brent and mainly rented in Hillsview and Pleydon Close, with no more than 2 percent known to be second homes or holiday lets.
